## Brief Introduction

The Year 2020 was marked as a significant year for the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka since all developments were done even with the COVID 19 pandemic.

Most of the vacancies of academic and a few vacancies of non-academic staff have been filled and requests have been made to the Treasury for next year man power requirements. Most of the academic programmes were concluded on online basis.

## Achievements

- The Wayamba University of Sri Lanka held its $15^{\text {th }}$ General Convocation on $09^{\text {th }}$ January 2020 at Pandith Amaradeva Auditorium of the university premises. A total of 818 undergraduate and 68 postgraduate degrees were conferred their degrees from four faculties.
- The Faculty of Agriculture \& Plantation Management held the $18^{\text {th }}$ Agricultural Research Symposium (AGRES) on $07^{\text {th }}$ June 2020.
- 275 students were admitted for the $15^{\text {th }}$ Intake of B.Sc. (Plantation Management) External Degree programme conducted by the Faculty of Agriculture \& Plantation Management on $26^{\text {th }}$ January 2020.
- Faculty Awards Ceremony of the Faculty of Applied Sciences was held on $20^{\text {th }}$ February 2020.
- $7^{\text {th }}$ Annual Symposium on Research and Industrial Training (ASTIRE) of the Department of Electronics was held on $31^{\text {st }}$ July 2020.
- $12^{\text {th }}$ Applied Science Business and Industrial Research Symposium (ASBIRES 2020) of the Faculty of Applied Sciences was conducted online on $22^{\text {nd }}$ December 2020.
- Annual Research Symposium in Management (ARSYM), Symposium of Accountancy and Finance Researches (SACFIRE) of the Faculty of Business Studies \& Finance were held online in the year 2020.

(1) The University is in the process of formulating proposals for the establishment of (02) new Faculties of Graduate Studies and Engineering.
(2) Acquisition of land in proximity to the University will be looked into for future expansions.

## 1. Introduction - Wayamba University of Sri Lanka



The Wayamba University of Sri Lanka was birthed as the Affiliated University College of the North Western Province in 1991 with two academic areas, namely, Home Science \& Nutrition and Agricultural Sciences. These sections were affiliated to the University of Kelaniya and University of Peradeniya respectively. Subsequently, it became the Wayamba Campus of the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka in 1996 with two Faculties - Faculty of Agricultural Sciences
and Faculty of Applied Sciences.
After that the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka was established with effect from $01^{\text {st }}$ of October, 1999 for the purpose of providing, promoting and developing higher education in the branches of learning of Applied Sciences, Business Studies \& Finance, Agriculture \& Plantation Management and Livestock, Fisheries \& Nutrition. Accordingly, four Faculties and 16 Departments of Study were assigned to the Wayamba University by the Government Notification in the Extraordinary Gazette No. 1093/8 issued on Tuesday, $17^{\text {th }}$ of August, 1999.

A new department has been established in the year 2016 in the Faculty of Agriculture \& Plantation Management under the name of Biosystems Engineering to offer a new degree programme in Bachelor of Bio Systems Technology (BBST) and two new departments have been established in the year 2016 in the Faculty of Applied Sciences under the names of Engineering Technology and Nano Science Technology. After that by two Extraordinary Gazettes of the Government No.1954/43 issued on $19^{\text {th }}$ February 2016 and No. 2037/17 issued on $21^{\text {st }}$ September 2017, the Faculty of Medicine with 15 departments and Faculty of Technology with 04 departments have been added to the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka respectively. Now there are 06 faculties and 37 departments in the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka.

### 19.4 Information Communication Technology Center - Kuliyapitiya Premises

### 19.4.1 Introduction

Information Communication Technology (ICT) Center is the primary provider of computing and information technology and multimedia, video and photography resources, services, and support to Kuliyapitiya Premises of Wayamba University of Sri Lanka. It provides IT training programs for students, staff, and external professionals and students to improve on the demanding IT skills. It is committed to the support of academic activities by promoting on-campus information literacy, and by providing a suitable information technology environment. To ensure the smooth proceeding of educational and research activities, the center also offers comprehensive services using the latest advances in information technology. These services include running servers (web, Intercom and LMS), maintaining the networks that form the university's IT infrastructure, promoting e-learning initiatives such as computerization of teaching materials and the use of learning management systems, and providing support to departments and units in order make their information and data available online.

### 19.4.6 Constrains if any

> Since the current building is very old and not suitable for the purpose, a new building is required for the ICT Center, Kuliyapitiya.
> Increase the number of academic staff with the increase in student demand due to establishment of new faculties.
> As the ICT infrastructure is expanded in the Kuliyapitiya premises from only two faculties to four, the on-time maintenance and services requires additional office staff such as Technical Officers, System Developers, and Web Developers.
> Workshops for outsiders.

- Expand the laboratory area to compensate the increase in the internal and external student intake.
> Expand the wireless network.
$>$ Staff Training.
$>$ Training students for General ICT Certification Test.
> Setting up a Student-Based company which undertakes external projects in software development / computer networking and information systems development.
> Increase the services and knowledge areas offered to the internal as well as the external students in keeping up with the demand.


### 19.4.8 Any other relevant information

As there are vast number of opportunities and demand for ICT knowledge and services, work towards transforming the ICT center as an ICT Knowledge and Services Center for Wayamba University of Sri Lanka as well as for the general public. The ICT center is one of the key points for public engagement as well as providing an educational interface to the public. To enhance these interfacing activities, it is highly recommended to reallocate the ICT center to a new building facility to expand its services, community engagement as well as to protect its equipment.

### 19.5 Information Communication Technology Center - Makandura Premises

### 19.5.1 Introduction

The ICT Centre of Wayamba University of Sri Lanka, Makandura premises was established to cater the knowledge on Information Technology for students to meet the challenges in rapidly developing communication system in their relevant field. It will facilitate to acquire computer literacy and to perform their career hereafter.

The ICT Centre is continued to offer courses on Information Technology and Advanced Computer Applications to the Faculty of Agriculture and Plantation Management and course on Information Technology to the Faculty of Livestock Fisheries and Nutrition. For statistics related courses conducted by the Departments are supported by the ICT Centre especially for practical. Further, two courses, Information Technology and e-Commerce and Management Information Systems are conducted to the students of External Degree of Plantation Management. The Centre now expands its services by offering several IT related course for the benefits of the people in North-Western Province.

The ICT Centre is opened from 8.00 am to 8.00 pm in week days, 8.00 am to 5.00 pm on weekends. In examination period, opening duration is 8.00 am to 10.00 pm on week days.

### 19.6 Medical Center



There are two functioning medical centers in Wayamba University of Sri Lanka. One Medical Center is situated in Kuliyapitiya and the other Medical Center is in Makandura. Both Medical Centers have played a key role in providing healthcare facilities to students and other staff members of the University throughout the year 2020.

While the Medical Center in Kuliyapitiya had all the basic facilities required for treating the students and the other staff members, Medical Center in Makandura was still under construction during the year 2020 .
The staff of the Kuliyapitiya medical center in 2020 comprised of a nursing officer, a public health inspector, one pharmacist, a stenographer; an attendant and works aid. The staff of Makandura Medical center in 2020 comprised of a nursing officer, one Pharmacist, Public Health Inspector and an attendant. Two Medical Officers covered up the duties in both Medical Centers in 2020.

The medical certificates of newly appointed University staff and newly entered students for the year 2018/2019 were certified by the Medical Officer. Medical Examinations were done for the students who were selected for sports events and for Canteen workers.
Other than treating minor ailments of students and staff medical center played a major role in prevention of diseases and enhancing health education among University students. There were many health promotion programmes done in year 2020.

# 19.7 Wayamba University Business Incubation Center (WUBIC) / University Business Linkage (UBL) Cell 

### 19.7.1 Introduction

Wayamba University of Sri Lanka (WUSL) implemented Wayamba University Business Incubation Center (WUBIC) with the primary objectives of developing practice and businessoriented student's projects, implementing (technical) consulting services for businesses, promoting research cooperation between businesses and the university and promoting strategic alliances with the private sector in order to develop the research infrastructures and capacities at universities in 2015. In order to, encourage entrepreneurial activities Intellectual Property (IP) policy was also adopted to promote research cooperation between businesses and the University. Any currently registered student, recently graduated (until 5 years from their date of graduation) student and academic, administrative and academic support staff member of Wayamba University of Sri Lanka is eligible for membership in WUBIC and considered as an incubate. During their incubating period of the business, WUBIC will nurture them providing furnished office space, laptops with internet facility, other office equipment with stationaries and transport means to thrive in business world up to two years.

In 2018, WUBIC was streamlined with the University Business Linkage (UBL) Cell activities under the Accelerating Higher Education Expansion and Development (AHEAD) project funded by world bank. Primary goal of UBL Cell is creating a set of entrepreneurial academics which in turn enable to develop entrepreneurial skills in undergraduates ultimately contribute to uplift the national economy. Exploring avenues to commercialize the products manufactured by academic, graduate and undergraduate student community of Wayamba University of Sri Lanka and identifying potential industries in order to transfer technologies developed as research outcomes of university academics are major activities of UBL cell.

a. Closing balances of the Bank Accounts maintained by the University as shown in the Statement of Financial Position have been reconciled with the relevant cash books. The respective Banks were requested to send in their confirmation of balances direct to the Auditor General. This amount is equal to the short term commitments.
b. The stock value shown in the Statement of Financial Position amounting to Rs. $29,808,151$ was arrived on physical verification of stores. This verification was done in order to establish the ownership, existence and the value of the items including the manner in which the accounting records are maintained for stock items. Verified balances of Stocks have taken into Books of Accounts
c. The value of capital work in progress as shown in the Statement of Financial Position was Rs. 160,625,649. Valuation of capital work in progress was also carried out in keeping with the Sri Lanka Accounting Standards.

## SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## 1. Reporting Entity

Wayamba University of Sri Lanka has been incorporated under the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978, and located at the Kandulla, Kuliyapitiya, Sri Lanka.

### 1.1. Date of Authorization for Issue

The Financial Statements of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka were authorized for issue by the Council dated on $23^{\text {rd }}$ February 2021.

### 1.2. Reporting Period

The financial period of the University represent from $01^{\text {s1 }}$ January 2020 to $31^{\text {st }}$ December 2020.

## 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

### 2.1 Statement of Compliance

The Financial Statements of the University have been prepared and presented in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards (SLPSAS's). However Sri Lanka Accounting Standards also have been used in the areas where no Public Sector Accounting Standards are available. These Financial Statements comprise the statement of Financial Position, Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Cash flows, Changes in equity and Notes to the Financial Statements.

### 2.2 Basis of measurement

The Financial Statements of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka have been prepared on the historical cost basis and apply consistently. When there are material deviations of the cost from the fair value, fair value has been used as measurement basis.

### 2.3 Materiality and Aggregation

Each material class of similar items have been presented separately in the financial statements. Items of dissimilar nature or function have been presented separately unless they are immaterial.

### 2.4 Offsetting

Assets and liabilities, revenue and expenses have not been offset unless required or permitted by SLPSAS and Sri Lanka Accounting Standards.

### 2.5 Comparative Figures

Comparative figures have been adjusted to confirm to changes in presentations in these financial statements where required according to the Sri Lanka public sector accounting standards.

2.6 Functional and Presentation Currency

The financial statements are presented in Sri Lanka Rupees, which is the University's functional and presentation currency.

### 2.7 Going Concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis.

### 2.8 Events after the Reporting Period

All material events after the reporting date has been considered and where appropriate adjustments or disclosures wherever necessary have been made in the Financial Statements.
2.9 Transaction of Foreign Currencies and Balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation at year end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognized in the statement of financial performance.

### 2.10 Rounding

The amounts in financial statements have been rounded-off to the nearest rupee, except otherwise indicated as permitted by the Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

### 2.11 Property, Plant \& Equipment

(a). Recognition and Measurement

Property, Plant \& Equipment are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

## (b). Initial Cost

The cost of Property, Plant \& Equipment comprises its purchase or construction cost and any directly contributable cost of bringing the asset to working condition for its intended use.

## (c). Subsequent Cost

Under the recognition principle of cost, the University does not recognize in the carrying amount of an item of property, plant and equipment the cost of the day-to-day servicing of the item.

Rather these costs are recognized in surplus or deficit as incurred. Costs of day-to-day servicing are primarily the costs of labour and consumables, and may include the cost of small parts. The purpose of these expenditures is often described as for the "repairs and maintenance" of the item of property, plant and equipment.

## (d). Depreciation

Depreciation is charged to the statement of financial performance on the straight line basis at the following rates per annum in order to write off the cost of such assets over their estimated useful lives.

Depreciation of an asset begins when it is available for use and ceases at the date that the asset is de-recognized or fully depreciated.

Depreciation is provided on pro rata basis on the assets purchased/ constructed/ disposed during the year.

## (e). Measurement after recognition

## (i) Revaluation model

After initial recognition all the property, Plant \& Equipment except library books have been carried at revalued amount, being fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and impairment loss.

Revaluation surplus may be transferred to the general reserve proportionately as the assets are used by the university. In such a case, the amount of the surplus transferred would be the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets and depreciation based on the assets original cost.

## (ii) Cost model

Due to practical issues revaluation model cannot be used for library books, Therefore library books are shown at cost \& written off on the straight line basis over period of five years.

## Capital Work-in - Progress

Capital expenses incurred which are not completed as at the reporting date are shown as Capital Work - in -Progress and Capital Work - in - progress would be transferred to Property, Plant and Equipment when it is available for use.

Even though some constructions were concluded during the year they were shown as work in progress as the total commitments were not settled and they were not taken over by the University.

### 2.13 Investments

Investments represent investment in fixed deposits and savings accounts. These investments have been accounted in compliance with SLFRS 09. The investment in fixed deposits and savings accounts have seen classified as financial instrument measured at amortized cost as per SLFRS 09
They are initially measured at fair value and subsequently measured at amortized cost by using effective interest rate as required by SLFRS 09.

## $2.14 \quad$ Assets

Assets are resources controlled by the University as a result of past events and from which future economic benefits or service potential are expected to flow to the University.

An asset shall be classified as current when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

(c). It is expected to be realized within twelve months after the reporting date; or
(d). It is cash or a cash equivalent (as defined in SLPSAS 2) unless it is restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after reporting date.

All other assets shall be classified as non-current assets.

## Inventories

Inventories are stated at cost and determined on First in First out (FIFO) basis and the verified stock values were taken in to the statement of financial position. Physically verified stock schedules of all the stores are sent separately.

Receivables are stated at the amounts they are estimated to be realized.
2.18 Advances to Staff

Advances to staff comprise, festival Advances, Salary advance and Special advances.
2.19 Cash \& Cash Equivalents

Cash \& cash equivalents comprise cash in hand and at bank.

### 2.20 Accounting for Government Grants

### 2.20.1 Recurrent Grant

Recurrent grants are recognized in the Statement of Financial Performance on cash basis. Cost of rehabilitation of PPE and capital grants for construction and new work are recognized either as work in progress or Capital Assets where necessary.

### 2.20.2 $\quad$ Capital Grants

Government Grants for the Capital expenditure has presented in the Financial Statements in accordance with the LKAS 20. According to the LKAS 20 Capital Grants has been recognized as deferred income in the statement of financial position and amortized over the useful life of the asset as follows.

## $2.21 \quad$ Liabilities \& Provisions

All known liabilities as at the financial position date are included in the Financial Statements and adequate provisions are made for liabilities which are known to exist but the amount of which cannot be determined accurately.

Obligations payable on demand or within one year of the financial position date are treated as current liabilities in the statement of financial position. Liabilities payable after one year from the financial position date are treated as non-current liabilities in statement of financial position.

### 2.22 <br> Endowment Fund

Endowments funds include restricted donations received by the University and investment returns generated from endowments fund are used in accordance with the various purpose established by the donors.
2.23 (a)Defined Contribution Plans

Employees of the University are entitled for Universities Provident Fund (UPF) and Employees Trust Fund (ETF) in line with respective statutes and regulations. The University contributes $7 \%$ and $3 \%$ on gross emoluments of the employees to the Universities Provident Fund and to the Employee's Trust Fund respectively. Further University contributes $8 \%$ on gross emoluments of the employees to the Universities Pension Fund as a retirement benefits. These are recognized as expense in the statement of financial performance as incurred.

## (b)Defined Benefit Plans

A defined benefit plan is a post-employment benefit plan other than a defined contribution plan. The defined benefit is calculated by independent actuarial valuer using projected unit credit method as recommended by SLPSAS 19 "Employee benefits". The present value of the defined benefit obligation is determined by discounting the estimated future cash outflows using interest rates that are denominated in the currency in which the benefits will be paid and that have terms to maturity approximating to the terms of the related liability. The present value of the defined benefit obligations depends on a number of factors that are determined on an actuarial basis using number of assumptions about discount rate, future salary increments \& mortality rates. The rates used in determining the defined retirement benefit obligations are given in Note 17. Any changes in these assumptions will impact the carrying amount of defined benefit obligations.

Provision has been made for retirement gratuities from the beginning of service for all employees, in conformity with SLPSAS 19 on employee benefits. Provision are made to all employees those who become eligible under the Gratuity Act No. 12 of 1983, the liability to an employee arises only on

completion of 5 years of continued service. This provision is not fully externally funded. However an external fund of Rs.5Mn was established as per the UGC, Audit Committee decision. (Minutes of the $4^{\text {th }}$ meeting of the Accounting Treatment Committee - Paragraph No.09)

### 2.24 Current Liabilities

Current Liabilities are those, which fall due for payment on demand or within one year from the financial position date. Non-Current Liabilities will fall due for payment one year or more after the financial position date.

The goods delivered and the payments made in 2021, in respect of purchase orders placed during the year 2020 were not considered as accrued expenses for 2020 as per Treasury Circular No. 111.

### 2.25 Taxation

The University is exempt from Income Tax under the Inland Revenue Act No. 24 of 2017.

### 2.26 Contingent Liabilities and Contingent assets

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existence will be continued by the occurrence or nonoccurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the programme or a present obligation that is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation.

A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be measured reliably. The uncertainty does not recognize a contingent liability but disclose its existence in the financial statement.

A contingent asset is a possible asset that arises from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or nonoccurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the university. The university does not recognize contingent asset but discloses its existence where inflow of economic benefits are probable but not virtually certain.

### 2.27 Income \& Expenditure Recognition.

### 2.27.1 Revenue

(a) Government Grant for Recurrent Expenditure, Student Bursaries and Mahapola, etc. are recognized in the Statement of Financial Performance on Cash basis.
(b) Interest Income from outside investments is recognized based on the effective rate of interest.
(c) Interest Income from Staff Loans is accounted based on the effective rate of interest.
(d) Revenue Generated from internal sources such as Income from Student Registration, Examination, Tuition \& Library fees, Fee levying income, Medical fees. etc. are accounted on cash basis.
(e) Rent from properties; staff quarters, home rent, electricity \& water charges are accounted on accrual basis.
(f) Hostel fees are accounted on accrual basis.

### 2.27.2 Expenditure

a. All Expenditure incurred in the running of the University and in maintaining the Capital Assets in a state of efficiency has been charged to the revenue in arriving at surplus/ deficit for the year.
b. All expenditure incurred in the acquisition, extension or improvement of assets of a permanent nature in order to carry on or increase the serving capacity of the University has been treated as Capital Expenditure.

### 2.28 Cash Flow Statement

 The Cash Flow Statement has been prepared using the indirect method.

### 2.29.1 Present status of sub-projects won by Wayamba University of Sri Lanka Accelerating Higher Education Expansion and Development Operation (AHEAD)

The development of the higher education sector is of central importance to enable Sri Lanka to make the transition from a Lower-Middle Income Country (LMIC) to an Upper Middle-Income Country (UMIC). Recognizing this, the Government of Sri Lanka (GoSL) and the World Bank have agreed to support the higher education sector through a World Bank funded project titled "Accelerating Higher Education Expansion and Development (AHEAD) operation." The AHEAD operation is organized in two components. The first is a Program Component that supports the national Higher Education Development Program. The second is a systems strengthening, capacity building and technical assistance component that will assist GoSL to strengthen the higher education sector and achieve the objectives of the AHEAD program by monitoring and evaluation, policy analysis, program coordination and communication. The implementing agency of the project is the Ministry of Education. (ME) There is an "Operations Monitoring and Support Team" (OMST) which coordinate and support all AHEAD activities among the ME, UGC, and the universities.

The AHEAD has three Results Areas (RA):
Results Area 1: Increasing Enrolment in Priority Disciplines for Economic Development
Results Area 2: Improving the Quality of Higher Education
Results Area 3: Promoting Research, Development and Innovation.
Grants under RA2 and RA3 are awarded under competitive basis. The units of the universities (faculties and departments, and research teams) got opportunity to submit proposals. During the last couple of years, the OMST called proposals for such awards and the updated list of awards received to WUSL is given in the table.
The Operations Technical Secretariat (OTS) established by the university to assists the faculties, departments and other units in implementation of their subprojects, particularly in handling financial and procurement activities and advising them in timely implementation of their projects. The OTS is operated by a staff comprising both fulltime staff and part time staff.

### 2.29.2 Wayamba University Township Development Project

The project is designed to develop academic facilities and infrastructure of the university as well as re enforce the livelihood of the people who live in immediate surrounding area of the university. The major objective of the above project is to establish a knowledge based self-reliant and sustainable community interactive system for the Wayamba University, Sri Lanka and covers Kuliyapitiya premises and Makandura premises The project is implemented by the Ministry of Education.

The Saudi Fund for Development (SFD) has agreed to provide a concessional loan of SAR 105 Million (USD 28 Million) for the above project, as the loan charge $2 \%$ per annum and includes term of loan of 25 years including 5 year grace period.

The project started on 24th October 2017 as the agreement signed with Saudi Fund For Development \& Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka. Initial project period is 3 years to implement the project and withdrawal period shall be end of January 2022.

Up to now the University received Rs: 608,100 worth lab equipment and Rs: $8,564,557$ worth furniture from the Town ship project.

### 2.29.3 Revaluation of Property. Plant \& Equipment

(a). Land have been revalued by valuation department as at 31/12/2013 and revalued value of Kuliyapitiya Premises is Rs: 285,750,000/- \& Makandura Premises Rs: is Rs: 40,000,000/-.
(b). Buildings, Electricity Supply and Water supply System revalued as at 31.12.2016, Other Fixed Asset categories except Library Books \& Periodicals purchased up to 31.12 .2013 revalued to the date of 31.12.2013 and Revaluation surplus has been transferred to revaluation reserve. If there is revaluation loss, it may be transferred to statement of financial performance. Motor Vehicles have been revalued by Automobile Association of Ceylon. The rest of the items have been revalued by internally appointed committees.
(c). List of Property, Plant \& Equipment as at 31/12/2019 has been given to the Valuation Department for revalue Property, Plant \& Equipment. The Valuation Department has completed the verification and report has not yet been issued. Therefore impact of revaluation of Property, Plant \& Equipment has to be adjusted in the Financial Statement in year 2021 when the report is received.

### 2.29.4 Land for Faculty of Medicine

Action are being proceeded to acquire a land of 28 acres and 12.84 perches of land called "Mahanugalanda Watte" for the Faculty of Medicine.

The said land had been valued for Rs: 77,872,750.00 by the Department of Valuations. Administrative charges for the acquisition was Rs: 467,762.51 and a deposit of Rs: $16,500,000.00$ has been made earlier by the University. Accordingly a sum of Rs: $61,840,512.21$ has to be paid to the Divisional Secretary (Kuliyapitiya- West) to proceed the acquisition. The Chairman of UGC was requested through secretary, Ministry of Higher Education by the Vice-Chancellor of the University to allocate above funds and revise the original allocation of Rs. 70 Mn to 91 Mn for the acquisition process.

The amount to be paid to the "Mahanugalanda Watta" Land can not be calculated exactly, because the land should be valued by the Valuation Department and the interest ( $7 \%$ ) should be calculated to the new valuation.

As informed by the Divisional Secretarial - Kuliyapitiya (West) there is a court case at District Court - Kuliyapitiya to seek the ownership of "Mahanugalanda Watta" Land. Until the decision of the District Court Kuliyapitiya is given, the payment can not be done by the University.

# Proposal for Sustainable Development 

## Wayamba University of Sri Lanka

1. The Wayamba University of Sri Lanka admits approximately 1500 students annually under its six Faculties. Further, each year around 900 graduands are produced by these Faculties, providing the human resources required for the economic development of the country. Through this process, the University has the ability to produce the human resources necessary for the eradication of poverty in Sri Lanka.
2. The Faculties of Agriculture \& Plantation Management and Livestock, Fisheries \& Nutrition located at Makandura Premises of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka, continuously engage in research to introduce diverse species of crops and various types of food which supports the poverty alleviation efforts of the country.
3. The Faculty of Medicine at Wayamba University of Sri Lanka was established as the $10^{\text {th }}$ Faculty of Medicine in Sri Lanka, and two batches of students totaling 150 students have been admitted to the Faculty. The Kuliyapitiya Base Hospital has been converted to the status of a Teaching Hospital and action is being taken to establish Professorial Unit as well. The Faculty of Medicine consists of fifteen Departments and the objective of the University is to provide the facilities to produce physicians required to improve the health conditions the country.
4. The University is making every effort to offer an education of the highest quality to the students through quality assurance programmes, so that the education of Sri Lanka, a developing country, can be enhanced. A Quality Assurance Unit has also been established in the University. In addition, the University also provides technical and industrial training to improve the quality of education.
5. In all events organized by the University gender equity and equality is maintained.
6. With regard to sanitation and water, the total water consumption requirement of the University is provided by tube wells and the water is filtered for the use of the students and staff. The quality of the water is checked regularly. In collaboration with the

University Medical Centre, Public Health Inspectors, Cleaning Service and the Landscape Division, action is being taken to offer better sanitation for the staff and the students.
7. For the conservation of power and energy, the following actions have been taken by the University :

- Using only CFL Bulbs wherever lighting is required.
- Proposals have been submitted for generating electricity through solar power
- Buildings have been constructed with glass covers to allow sunlight into the building.

8. All courses offered by the University include an industrial training component and when new programmes are evolved and existing programmes are revised, the University aims to resolve the question of unemployment. Further, the University expects to establish a Faculty of Engineering, and through this Faculty it is hoped to provide the human resources required by the country in the field of engineering.
9. The Faculty of Technology is a newly established Faculty in the University and priority is given in this Faculty for innovations. The infrastructure requirement for this purpose is developed by the University.
10. The BREAD Centre and Business Incubation Centre of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka, provides incentives for new inventions and also introduces the market for such new products.

Through the above, the technical and entrepreneurial knowledge requirements of the community too are provided.
11. Action is being taken for the maximum use of resources and the following are some of them :

- Recycling of once used water at the Faculty of Medicine
- Garbage is collected separately categorized into degradable material - glass, polythene/plastic and paper, and disposed appropriately

12. In all Premises of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka green concept is maintained and the Landscape Division of the University takes care of tree planning, their security and maintenance.
13. The University consists of students and staff belonging to different nationalities and religions and in all activities University acts with a view to developing mutual conviviality. Conducting religious activities of all religions on the $1^{\text {st }}$ of January, attending to decorations and activities of different religious festivals by all, etc. contributes to the mutual geniality.
14. The Wayamba University of Sri Lanka seeks to establish interactions with other educational and financial institutions within the country and in foreign countries through Memoranda of Understanding. This allows students and staff to develop national and international relations.

# Report of the Auditor General in terms of Section 12 of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018 on the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2020 and other legal and regulatory requirements of Wayamba University of Sri Lanka 

## 1. Financial Statements

### 1.1 Opinion

The audit of the financial statements of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2020 comprising the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2020 and the statement of financial performance, statement of changes in net assets and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154 (1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with the provision of the sub-section 107 (5) of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978 and National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018. This report contains my views and observations which I mean to be published along with the Annual Report of the University in terms of Sub-section 108 (1) of the Universities Act. My report to Parliament in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(6) of the Constitution will be tabled in due course.

In my opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka as at 31 December 2020 and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

### 1.2 Basis for Opinion

I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards (SLAuSs). My responsibilities, under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of my report. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

### 1.3 Other information included in the 2020 Annual Report of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka

The other information comprises the information included in the University's 2020 Annual Report but does not include the financial statements and my auditor's report thereon, which is expected to be made available to me after the date of this auditor's report. Management is responsible for the other information.

My opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and I do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with my audit of the financial statements, my responsibility is to read the other information identified above and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or my knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

When I read the University's 2020 Annual Report, if I conclude that there are material misstatements therein, I am required to communicate that matter to those charged with governance for correction. If further material uncorrected misstatements are existed those will be included in my report to Parliament in pursuance of provisions in Article 154 (6) of the Constitution that will be tabled in due course.

### 1.4 Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of financial statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards, and for such internal control as management determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the University's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intend to liquidate the University or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the University's financial reporting process.

As per Section 16(1) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018, the University is required to maintain proper books and records of all its income, expenditure, assets and liabilities, to enable annual and periodic financial statements to be prepared of the University.

### 1.5 Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

My objective is to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes my opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards, I exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. I also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the University ability to continue as a going concern. If I conclude that a material uncertainty exists, I am required to draw attention in my auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify my opinion. My conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of my auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the University to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

I communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that I identify during my audit.

## 2. Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

2.1 National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018 includes specific provisions for following requirements.
2.1.1 I have obtained all the information and explanation that required for the audit and as far as appears from my examination, proper accounting records have been kept by the University as per the requirement of section 12 (a) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.
2.1.2 The financial statements presented is consistent with the preceding year as per the requirement of section 6 (1) (d) (iii) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.
2.1.3 The financial statements presented includes all the recommendations made by me in the previous year as per the requirement of section 6 (1) (d) (iv) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.
2.2 Based on the procedures performed and evidence obtained were limited to matters that are material, nothing has come to my attention;
2.2.1 to state that any member of the governing body of the University has any direct or indirect interest in any contract entered into by the University which are out of the normal cause of business as per the requirement of section 12 (d) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018;
2.2.2 to state that the University has not complied with any applicable written law, general and special directions issued by the governing body of the University as per the requirement of section 12 (f) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018;
2.2.3 to state that the University has not performed according to its powers, functions and duties as per the requirement of section $12(\mathrm{~g})$ of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.
2.2.4 to state that the resource of the University has not procured and utilized economically, efficiently and effectively within the time frames and in compliance with the applicable laws as per the requirement of section 12 (h) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.

### 2.3 Other Matters

(a) Provision of Rs. 13.5 million given during the year under review by the General Treasury for the procurement of Land, buildings and IT equipment to the university had not been utilized for the expected activities even by the end of the year under review.
(b) Even though a total sum of Rs. 17,513,750 had been paid in 2013 and 2016 respectively to the Divisional Secretaries of Pannala and Kuliyapitiya for the acquisition of lands for the University, the lands had not been acquired even by the end of the year under review.
(c) Even though a sum of Rs. 4,293,155 had been paid on 16 January 2020 to the Ceylon electricity Board for the supply of bulk electricity to the hostel complex of the Medical Faculty of the Wayamba University, the work had not been completed even by the end of the year.
(d) Total outstanding amount of Rs.11,062,012 for 03 suppliers for more than one year had not been settled even by the end of the year under review.
(e) Even though a sum of Rs. 3,437,160 was given by the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization for the "The Assessment of water and sediment quality and associated sea urchin of the gulf of manner coastline" project in the years 2014 and 2016, only a sum of Rs. 1,170,721 was spent. The relevant project had not been completed even by 31 December of the year under review and a sum of Rs. 2,266,439 had been remained underutilize for more than 4 years.
(f) Four official quarters constructed at Kuliyapitiya and Makandura premises at a cost of Rs. Rs. $41,825,013$ had not been utilized and remained idle from the year 2019 till the audited date of 17 February 2021.
(g) The total value of bills submitted in respect of 22 construction projects in 2019 amounted to Rs. $32,200,139$ had not been paid even till the end of the year under review

### 2.3 Other Matters

## (a) Purchase of Lands and Buildings

Bids were called in the year 2020 for the purchase of a land for Makandura Premises and a bid was received to the value of Rs. 13.5 Mn . As the relevant land was suitable for the expansion and development of the Makandura Premises, a valuation was called from the Valuation Department for the current value of the land. The Valuation Department valued the land at Rs. 12.5 Mn.

The land owner was informed of the valuation and he has indicated his willingness to sell the land to the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka at Rs. 12.5 Mn . The Council at its $219^{\text {th }}$ Meeting held on 06.08.2021 approved the acquisition of this land and it is expected to forward the matter to the Ministry of Education to obtain the Cabinet approval.

## Purchase of IT Equipment

Requests for equipment to the value of Rs. 1 Mn . was received from the Information Communication Technology Centre in December 2020 and purchase orders had been issued within the year 2020 for all items. Action has been taken to make the payments for the relevant goods in early 2021.
(b) Land at Labuyaya where the Faculty of Medicine is located

As per the Land Acquisition Act, a case has been filed at the District Courts by the Divisional Secretary, Kuliyapitiya West in order to confirm the ownership of this land and until such time the case is completed the acquisition of the land was not possible.

As soon as the Court proceedings are completed the matter will be carried forward.

## Paddy Land at Makandura Premises

A sum of Rs. 1,013,750 had been paid by the Wayamba University to the Divisional Secretary, Pannala as an advance for the purchase of 08 plots of paddy land. Action is being taken by the Divisional Secretary, Pannala to make this acquisition.

In order to expedite the acquisition of these paddy lands, the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka, by letter dated 02.08.2021, requested the Secretary, Ministry of Education to issue a notice under Section 38 (a) of the Land Acquisition Act.
(c) In the supply of bulk electricity to the hostel complex of the Faculty of Medicine, removal of trees and branches blocking the cable path have been removed. The charges of Rs. $455,025.00$ due to the Electricity Board for this purpose have been paid on 15.08.2021. The Electricity Board has informed the University of the requirement of signing the agreement for supply of electricity after a field test.

Prior to signing the agreement, as per the instructions of the Electricity Board, action is being taken to remove the electricity cables above the Pradeshiya Sabha road that connects the Faculty of Medicine land and hostel land.
(d) These supply creditors relate to the payments due for the contract for fixing the Air Conditioning System at the Faculty of Applied Sciences and the purchase of items by the Maintenance Division. At present, action is being taken to settle the balance due to the supply creditors.
(e) This project has been awarded to Prof. (Mrs.) J.A.D.S.S. Jayakody from the Faculty of Livestock, Fisheries \& Nutrition. She had requested the University Finance Committee to recommence work of the project, as given in FC Memo No. 141.21 and 142.17. The University Finance Committee had recommended that the Council approval be obtained for recommencement of work, with a written consent from the Food \& Agriculture Organization.

The related revised budget and other documentation have been submitted to the Council at its meeting held on October 2021.
(f) Action has been taken to hand over the staff quarters constructed at Makandura Premises to the relevant officers with effect from 02.03.2021.

Out of the staff quarters constructed at Kuliyapitiya Premises, the Dean, Faculty of Business Studies \& Finance had informed that he will not take over the quarters allocated to him. Therefore, action has been taken to hand these quarters to Dr. Kumara Uluwatte and Dr. Kumarayapa from 07.04.2021.
(g) Out of the 22 Projects mentioned in the query, Bill No. 03 and 22 (Construction of Faculty Building Stage II FAPM, Makandura, Hostel Stage VI, Makandura) have already been paid. 05 Bills (Nos. 06, 07, 08, 17, 18) have been checked by the Maintenance Division and action is being taken by the Capital Works Division to release them.

The balance 15 Bills are being checked by the Maintenance Division and action will be taken to expedite the payments.
